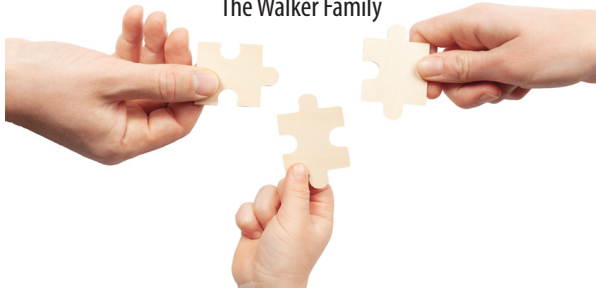

- **Firm**

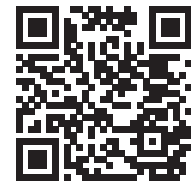
Strong, positive communication between co-parents benefits the parents and, most importantly, their children.
